

City Manager Matt DeWitt gave Council and the public an update on the Fiber Network build out on behalf of Assistant Utility Director David Eldridge highlighting that the entire system was complete through the city.

PUBLIC HEARING: **Public Hearing of Ordinance #2020-1008, amending Article 9, Table 905 and Adding Section 907.7 for Digital Billboards**

Mayor Senn convened a public hearing for the purpose of receiving comments concerning proposed changes to the zoning text, amending Article 9, Table 905 and Adding Section 907.7 for Digital Billboards.

No one spoke in favor of the zoning text change.

Molly Fortune, executive director of the Newberry Opera House offered comments in opposition of the zoning text change.

Mayor Senn declared the public hearing closed.

ORDINANCE: **Second and Final Reading of Ordinance #2020-1006, to set a fee schedule for the City of Newberry recreation complex splash park**

Councilman Glasgow made a motion, seconded by Councilman Wicker to accept second and final reading to set a fee schedule for the City of Newberry recreation complex splash park. Both children and adults will be charged a \$3 fee for admission. Mayor Senn stated there was also an option to purchase a 10-day punch pass for \$25. Locker rentals will be available for visitors at a rate of \$2 per day, per locker. The motion was carried following a unanimous vote of City Council members present.

ORDINANCE: **Second and Final Reading of Ordinance #2020-1008, amending Article 9, Table 905 and Adding Section 907.7 for Digital Billboards**

Councilman DuBose made a motion, seconded by Councilman Wicker to approve second and final reading of an ordinance amending Article 9, Table 905 and Adding Section 907.7 for Digital Billboards. The motion was carried following a unanimous vote of City Council members present. This ordinance allows digital billboards to be permitted in the Main Street interstate overlay.
